

IndUS of Fox Valley in collaboration with The Fox Cities Performing Arts Center featured a concert titled Sufiyana/Paramparik highlighting sufi (mystical) genre music. Three very accomplished musicians, Pandit Subhen Chatterjee on the Tabla, Vidushi Sahana Banerjee on the Sitar, and Vocalist Janab Arshad Ali Khan performed at Kimberly theater, PAC on April 26, 2024. The Trio has toured extensively throughout the world and were gracious enough to come to Northeast Wisconsin to share their music in the Fox Cities area. The event was attended by a diverse group of Indian Classical music enthusiasts. We had over two hundred people attend the concert.

The vocal and instrumental performances fittingly expressed the mystical sufiyana style of music. The combination of renditions was pleasing and celebrated the philosophical and spiritual parampara of divine music. The evening started with a classical based rendition in Yaman, an evening raga. Raga Yaman is said to be crafted by Amir Khusro, who is credited with introducing Khayal, Tarana, Gazal and Qawwali. Khayal or a composition may be as short as just four lines of text, describing nature or praising God or any other theme, and gives the vocalist the freedom to add numerous improvisations. The emphasis is on musical technique. Tarana is a fasttempo rhythmic piece with table beats. Qawwali is a devotional genre of the Sufis (Islamic mystics) of North India.



The audience was mesmerized by Arshad Ali khan's vocals along with Sahana Banerjee's sitar playing combined with the explosive improvisation on the Tabla by Pandit Subhen Chatterjee. Those who are familiar with Hindustani classical music enjoyed the jugalbandi (entwined twins or duet of two solo musicians) between the Vocalist Khan and Banerjee on Sitar. The other highlight of the evening was "Aaoge jab tum o saajana" in raga Tilak Kamod by Arshad Ali Khan, a tribute to his uncle, Ustad Rashid Khan, who recently passed away in January 2024.



"Baaje muraliya baaje," a famous and most praised bhajan (a devotional song) by legendary singers Late Pandit Bhimsen Joshi and Bharat Ratan Late Lata Mangeshkar was presented by the trio, transcending the audience to a state of blissful delight. The concert concluded with a Sufi rendition of a Bandish from Kirana Gharana in raag Bhairavi, this Raag is considered to be the King of ragas and traditionally sung to conclude a performance.






& Accomplishments
